This evening's concert is the culmination of half a term's work by the children involved. They have rehearsed weekly on a programme of songs themed around different aspects of Water - Rivers, Rain, Snow, Fish and the Ocean. Some of the music is complex and they are joined by the members of the Promenade Choirs, who provide harmony parts. The Choirs will finish the programme with a few songs from its summer concert.

Ocean World is a large scale choral work for children. It charts the travels of a Whale through the oceans, experiencing all the aspects of the environment. In this evening's concert we have chosen to include three songs from the start of the piece. The Enigma of the Deep talks of the mystery of the Oceans, in My World the Whale invites the audience to join him on his travels, and in Ocean World the massed choirs sing of the exciting world of the Oceans. This evening the Whale is sung by Miranda, who is a former pupil of Ashley School and the current senior mentor for the Junior Choir.

The Promenade Choirs were set up by Christopher in 2008 to provide a top quality choral experience supported by expert vocal tuition to the children of Walton and Hersham. There are members from across the borough of Elmbridge and beyond. The repertoire ranges from serious classical music (such as Handel's Messiah and Fauré's Requiem) to popular ballads and medleys from musicals. Christopher was Head of Voice at the London College of Music. He has years of experience teaching young voices. As well as being a consummate singer, he is also a qualified classroom teacher. He is the current musical director of the Weyward Singers.

The Promenade Choirs rehearse on a Monday evening at Bell Farm School - the Junior Choir from 6.30 to 7.45pm and the Youth Choir from 7.45 to 9pm. Membership is open to all. There is no audition, but the standard is high because of the support provided to those who join with little experience. New members are welcomed throughout the year. The atmosphere is hard-working but fun.

The choirs are mainly funded by fees, but it is understood that membership must be open to all children - so fees are discretely waived where parents would struggle to meet them.
